WHAT I NEED TO KNOW AS A CWC VOLUNTEER

1. What are the volunteer requirements?

- Be 18 28 years of age
- Be Proficient in English (Knowledge of Kiswahili is an added advantage)
- Have a valid passport (valid for a minimum of 1 year from the date of departure from Kenya)
- Make sure you have all the relevant vaccinations (Yellow Fever, Hepatitis A, Polio, Typhoid, COVID)
 *This is a Malaria zone; please refer to your GP or travel nurse for more information and come well-equipped.
- Sort out your return air ticket (or other mode of transport) to Nairobi.
- Sort out all your insurance (Health/ Life/ Travel/ Flying/ Medical)

 Inform us in case you have any disabilities or special needs, social/psychological or mental issues, addictions, food allergies or dependencies, or any other information you deem as important for us to know.

- You will be required to sort out your visitor visa(s) via https://etakenya.go.ke/
 Kindly email us to request for an invitation letter before your visa application process.
- Complete the Volunteer registration form and kindly share it with us on the following email before beginning your volunteership with CWC on impact@community-wildlife.org

2. How much will it cost me to volunteer?

As CWC runs on donations and sponsorships, we would appreciate your contributions of USD 450 per week for the duration you choose to volunteer with us (Max. 1 month), to be fully paid within the first two weeks of your time with us. This nominal fee is required to cover your accommodation, WiFi, meals with soft drinks, your SGR Ticket (to/fro Nairobi to Voi), transport to/fro the SGR to the lodges, and project materials to ensure we can continue our vital work while providing you with a comfortable stay.

To guarantee your spot as a volunteer, please send a deposit fee of USD 450 which will be deducted from the total fee once you start your volunteership.

Please contact us at impact@community-wildlife.org for detailed information on payment options. At the end of your experience with us, we would appreciate any continued support that you may want to give towards the projects and sustainability of CWC.

3. What is expected of me as a CWC volunteer?

We hope to see you make a lasting, positive impact towards all CWC Projects and tasks that you are part of. Remember to be respectful, disciplined, open-minded, hardworking and organized. You may need to prepare yourself emotionally and mentally as you face any cultural differences, dealing with underprivileged families, people from diverse backgrounds, different working cultures, etc.

We also look forward to any fundraising activity you come up with before/ during the period you volunteer with us.



4. What are the volunteer opportunities available for me?

At CWC, we offer a variety of volunteer roles tailored to your interests and skills. Here are some exciting ways you can get involved:

Assist in supporting school children through teaching, mentoring, skill-sharing and access to materials that enhance learning opportunities. 5. What can I do in my free time when I am not volunteering?

Volunteers are welcome to participate in various activities at the lodge, subject to the availability of personnel, the number of guests at the lodge, and the overall schedule for that period. Since availability may vary, activities will be discussed on-site to ensure that each volunteer can engage in what is possible during their stay.

6. What happens when I finish my volunteer ship with CWC?

We will also award you with a volunteer certificate and a letter (upon request).

- 3. **Confirmation**: Upon acceptance, you'll receive a welcome email with all necessary information.
- 4. **Orientation**: Attend a day's orientation session upon arrival for to familiarize yourself with our projects and protocols.

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING



- 1. I understand that I should not carry large sums of money around nor leave my personal belongings unattended. I also understand that Community and Wildlife Conservation (CWC) will not be responsible in any way for my personal belongings in the event of such loss or theft.
- 2. I have familiarised myself with the CWC Emergency Contacts and will always keep a copy of these numbers with me whilst off site.
- 3. I understand the CWC policy on alcohol abuse and the disciplinary procedures ensuing. I know that the evening before carrying out any project work, I am required to drink responsibly. I agree not to smoke in areas that are not designated smoking zones, or in the rooms at the accommodation at any time. I understand if I am caught by CWC staff taking illegal drugs I will be sent home. If I am caught using illegal drugs by the police or partake in illegal activities, I can be sent to jail. CWC and its affiliates will not be liable for my misdemeanour or bail if these actions were not directly involved with CWC and my volunteer work.
- 6. I agree to not receiving visitors on site without approval. I am aware about the repercussions of casual sex, including STDs, HIV/ Aids, bed bugs, etc.
- 7. I understand the conservative dress code guidelines and will not take offence if staff ask me to change while on the field or conducting my volunteer work.
- 8. I know that whilst I am off site I must remember that I am an ambassador of CWC. I therefore need to conduct myself well throughout my time in Kenya, including the weekends. It is important that I act sensitively and respectfully towards all the people I meet.
- 9. I agree not to purchase products made/ obtained from any wildlife or any endangered/ protected species. I also agree to using the water sparingly, water is a precious commodity.
- 10. I understand that I am responsible for covering any costs incurred while booking extra activities, and/or safaris and expeditions that are not included in the CWC volunteer package.
